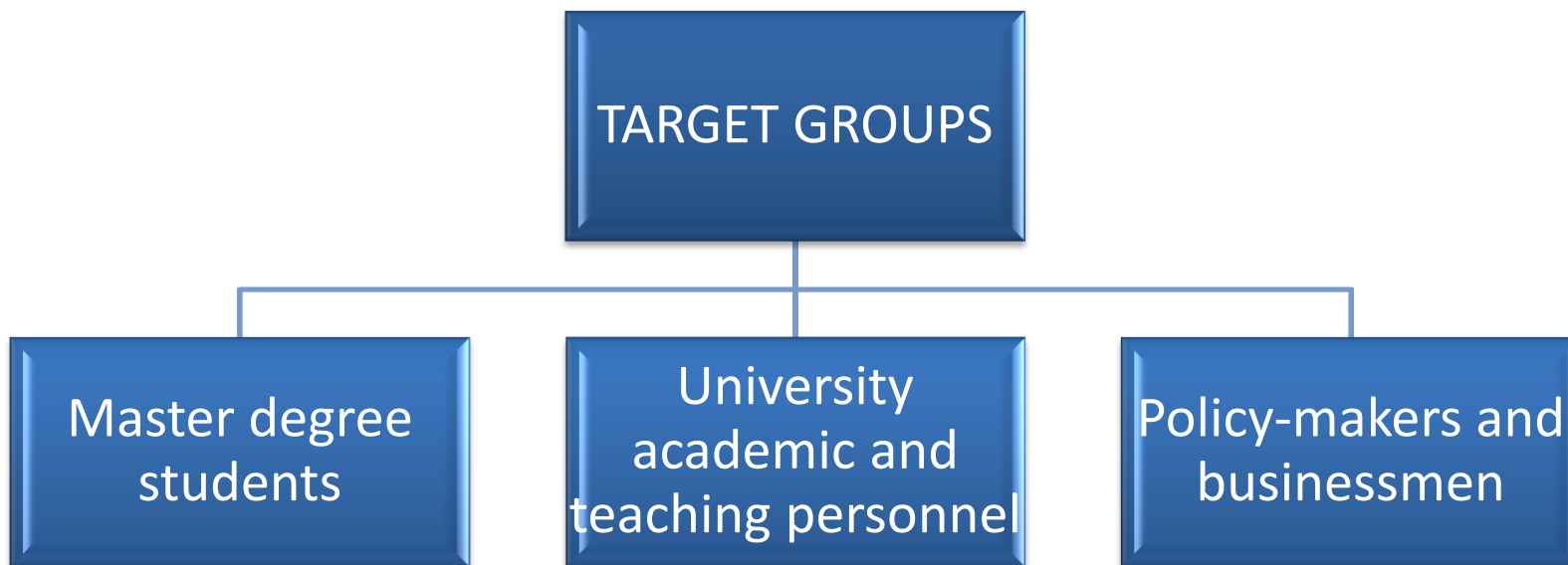

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2 main types of activities within the project:

1st activity involves introducing into the curricular and conducting two courses comprising the Master level Module in EU Studies in Business, Economics and Finance.

2nd type is in the form of the specialized workshops devoted to the selected topics in the EU Studies in Business, Economics and Finance. The potential participants of the workshops are students and academic staff, business and policy-makers.





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I st year of Jean Monnet Activities in TSUE (2018-2019)





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The 1st academic year we started from Lectures and Seminars. We gathered 50 students from the 1st year of Masters degree from 4 groups MXI-31 (World economy specialization), MMV-31 (Foreign trade activity specialization), MBD-31 and MBD-10 (Banking specialization), MIB-10 (Investment management specialization) MKF-10 (State finance management specialization).

The Module was divided into 2 sub-modules activities:

1. sub-module was conducted from February 4 up to 20, 2019.
2. sub Module was conducted from March 22 up to May 6, 2019.





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Module

1st sub-module “European Studies in Business and Economics” under the title of “European Business: Environment, Strategies and Structures” was conducted by PhD Oksana Galak from University of Viena (lecture sessions 28 hrs) from February 4 up to February 27, 2019 and prof. Norbay Karimov (seminar sessions 15 hrs) from TSUE within the period March 1- March 20, 2019. Oksana Galak worked out the content of lecture materials which was adopted up to the level of students and now this material is under probating with students. Norbay Karimov worked out seminar materials and now is in probating process which tools can be included in digest

2nd sub Module “European Studies in Finance” under the title of “European Finance: Current Environment and Perspectives” was conducted by PhD Lyudmila Muradova (lecture sessions 30 hrs) from TSUE from March 22 up to April 17, 2019 and PhD Fazliddin Nasreddinov (seminar sessions 15 hrs), TSUE for April 19 May 6, 2019. Lyudmila Muradova worked out lecture materials and now probating these materials in studying process to expound them in the best manner. Also she worked out the design of Certificates which were granted to the students who attended the Course. Fazliddin Nasreddinov worked out seminar materials and now is in probating process which tools can be included in digest.

After that the participants were greeted by the coordinator of the National Office of Erasmus+ in Uzbekistan, Abdurakhmanova A.K.





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Among the purposes of the Workshop was both providing the stage for discussion of the challenges in establishing cooperation with European counterparties, and highlighting the opportunities and benefits of such cooperation. That's why the representatives of business, commercial banks, leasing companies, and academic staff of universities were invited to take part in this discussion.
